2. I'd like to find out more about the world with my child - try "Atlas of Adventures" by Lucy Letherland (Wide Eyed Editions)
3. I'd like to find out more about art with my child - try "Katie's Picture Show" by James Mayhew (and then visit the National Gallery in London to see the pictures) (Orchard Books)
4. I'd like to find out more about Shakespeare and his plays with my child - try "The Comedy, History and Tragedy of William Shakespeare", written by Anna Claybourne and illustrated by Adria Meserve (Franklin Watts)
5. I'd like to find out more about science with my child - try the "What on Earth? Wallbook Timeline of Science and Engineering" by Chris Lloyd (What on Earth Publishing Ltd)
6. I'd like to encourage my child to read independently - try the very funny Pamela Butchart - titles include "Baby Aliens Got my Teacher" (Nosy Crow)
7. I'd like to find out more about the First World War with my child - try "Archie's War" by Marcia Williams (Walker)
8. I'd like to find some new stories featuring animals for my child - Reading's own Holly Webb has written lots of stories featuring cats, including her latest "Return to the Secret Garden" (Scholastic)
9. I'd like to help my child learn about computers and coding - try "Lift the Flap Computers and Coding" written by Rosie Dickins and illustrated by Shaw Nielsen (Usborne).
