Entertained beforehand with great energy by Cressida Cowell taming her dragons and then, after dinner, by a more thoughtful and personal story from Giles Andreae.

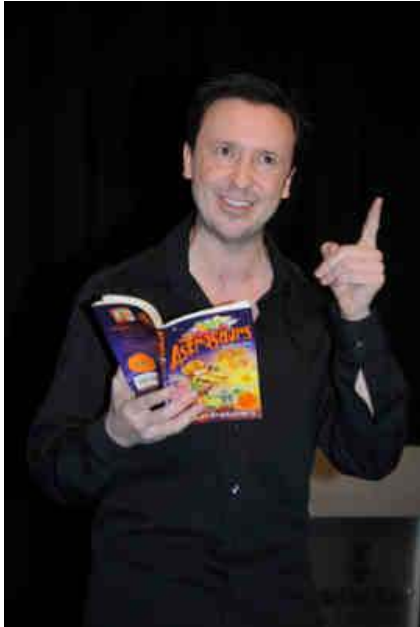
